Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this letter finds you well. I am writing to share some important updates following our recent OFSTED School Progress Monitoring Inspection. We are pleased to report that the inspection was a positive experience, and I would like to take this opportunity to share the findings with you.

This inspection was carried out at the request of the registration authority for independent schools. The purpose of the inspection was to monitor the progress the school has made in meeting the independent school standards. This inspection for progress monitoring was carried out unannounced. The inspector had conversations with the headteacher and the proprietor.

He engaged with leaders regarding the curriculum, assessment, and provisions for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). The inspector examined various documents, including those related to educational standards and the curriculum. The inspection also looked into the school's safeguarding procedures.

These requirements outlined in the independent school standards are fulfilled.

The inspector toured the school, which included attending lessons. He discussed students' experiences of school life with them and observed their behaviour during classes and throughout the school. The inspector also spoke with staff regarding their workload and well-being.

During the inspection, it was noted that the KS3 and KS4 curriculum is excellent, while we do not currently teach Key Stage 2 (KS2) and Key Stage 5 (KS5), it is important for us to have a curriculum in place for these stages. This was not discussed or mentioned in the original OFSTED inspection, but we are committed to addressing this recommendation promptly.

Our team understands the importance of forward planning and ensuring that we are prepared to offer a comprehensive and cohesive educational experience for all stages. We will be developing and implementing curricula for KS2 and KS5, ensuring that our students are well-prepared for future academic challenges.

We are grateful for the positive feedback and constructive recommendations provided by the inspector. Our commitment to continuous improvement remains steadfast, and we will be working diligently to enhance our school's offerings and ensure the highest quality education for our students.
